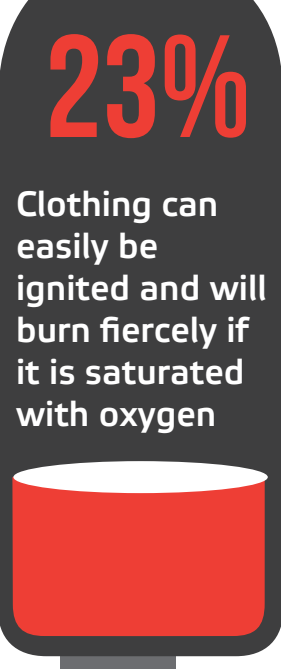
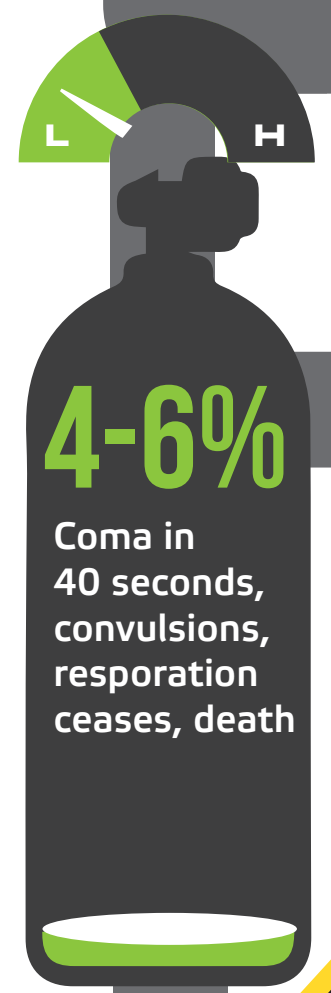
Confined space is defined as an enclosed or partially enclosed space that is not intended as a place of work or human occupancy.



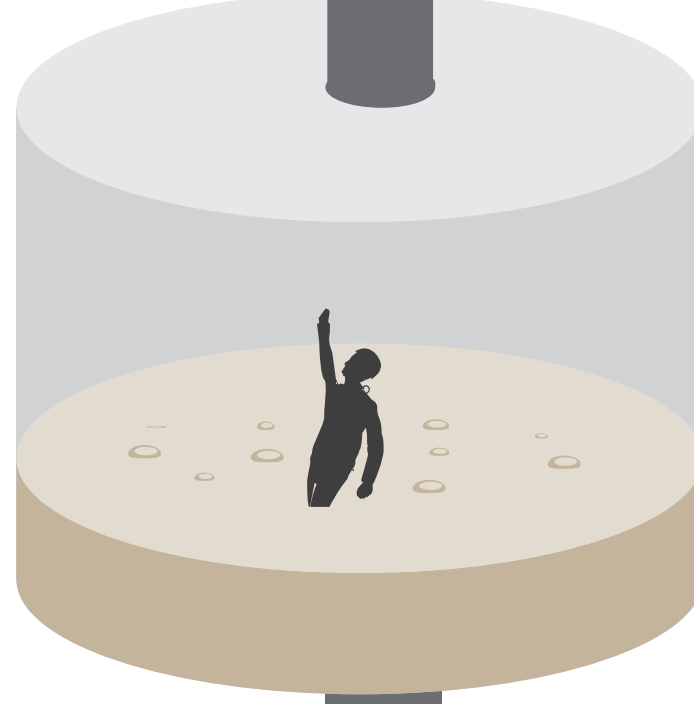

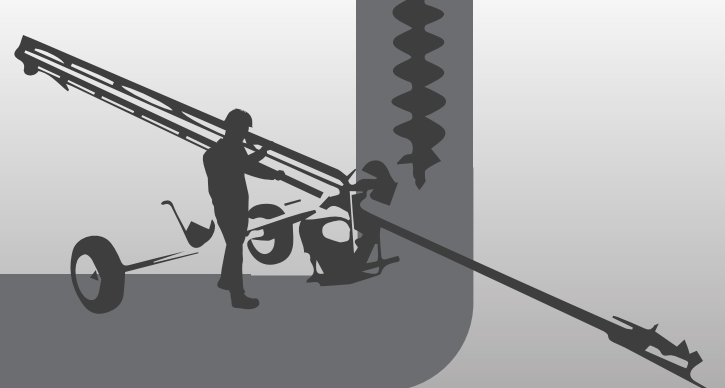
